Chemistry Faculty Position
Inorganic Chemistry

Position: The Hope College Chemistry Department invites applications for a tenure-track faculty position in inorganic chemistry to begin in Fall 2010. The position is expected to be offered at an Assistant Professor level. Candidates must have a Ph.D. in inorganic chemistry and postdoctoral experience. Primary teaching responsibilities will include inorganic chemistry lecture and laboratory and general chemistry. The development of a strong, externally-funded, experimental research program involving undergraduate students is expected. For this purpose, start-up funds will be provided. The Chemistry Department (www.hope.edu/academic/chemistry/) is a national leader in undergraduate research.

Application: Submit a curriculum vitae, a description of proposed research plans in the first five years, and a statement of teaching philosophy and competencies to **Dr. Graham Peaslee, Chairperson** (chemistry@hope.edu). Please have all materials submitted electronically in pdf format. A review of all completed applications will begin **October 2nd**. A subset of successful candidates will be asked to submit original transcripts, three letters of recommendation and additional materials describing their fit to the mission of the college in early October.
