CURRENT AND FUTURE ACCOUNTING & MANAGEMENT MAJORS:

It is recommended that both ACCT 221 (Financial Accounting) and ACCT 222 (Managerial Accounting) be completed by students by the end their sophomore year. Neither of these classes have any prerequisites. Both are prerequisites for ALL upper level accounting and management classes.

NOTE: MGMT 371 (FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT) WILL BE OFFERED IN MAY 2012 FOR ACCOUNTING MAJORS (PERMISSION OF INSTRUCTOR REQUIRED).

NOTE: Please do not sign up for both ACCT 221 and ACCT 222 the same semester. There is limited space. Both 221 and 222 will be offered in the Summer.

MANAGEMENT

MGMT 222 (Management Perspectives and Theory) requires that a C- or better be earned in order to enroll in other management courses (this applies to students who entered Hope College in 2009 or after).

MGMT 401 (Management Seminar): Senior Status is required for enrollment

MGMT 390 (Internships in Vocation) serves as an ELECTIVE in the Management Major.

MGMT 401 (Management Seminar) serves as the capstone requirement for the Management Major.

TRANSFER CREDITS

Transfer credit courses need to be 4 credits or an additional credit will be required.
