


Final Exam – The Exit Interview for Ed. 225, Exceptional Child

Students participate in an exit interview for the final exam. Members of the Hope Academy of Senior Professionals using questions designed by the professor interview them. The professor who is located in an area away from the students observes the interview. Groups of four students are interviewed at a time. Following the interview there is a debriefing session with the professor and interviewer.

19. What is the difference between a resource room, a special education class, and a special day school?
20. Give examples of how technology has facilitated learning/growth of exceptional persons. 
21. How does legislation address the needs of students from different cultural backgrounds?
22. How prepared do you feel for meeting the needs of exceptional persons in your chosen profession?
