

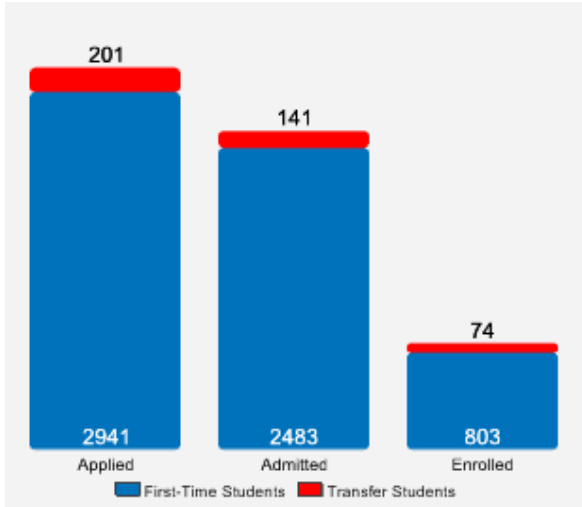


About Hope College

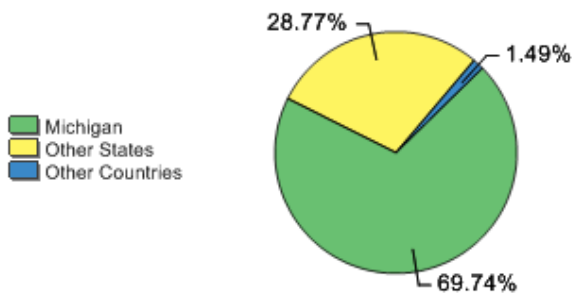

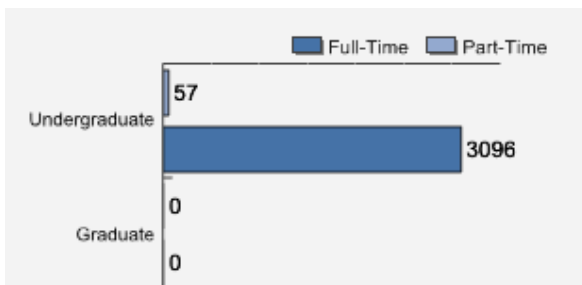

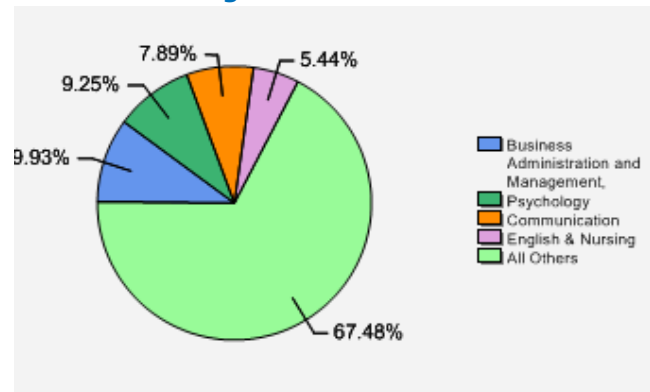

Bachelor's Degrees Awarded Last Year



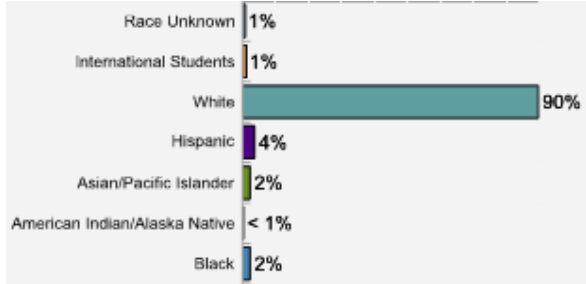

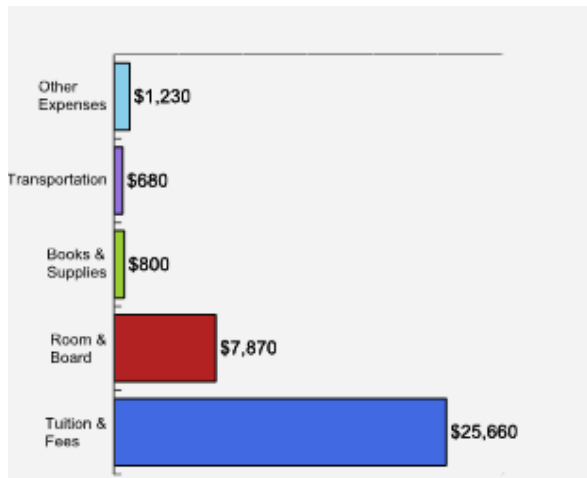

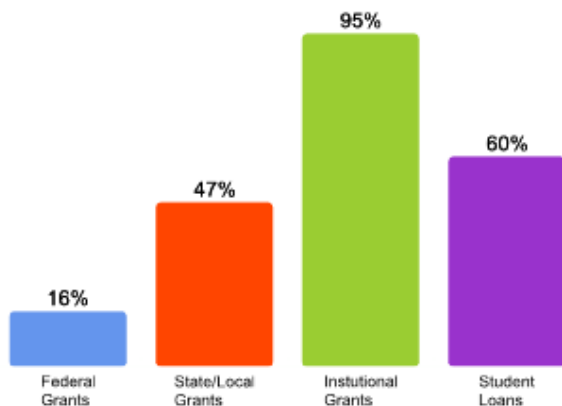

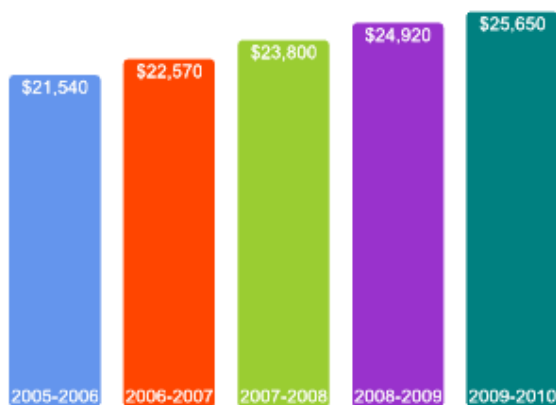
