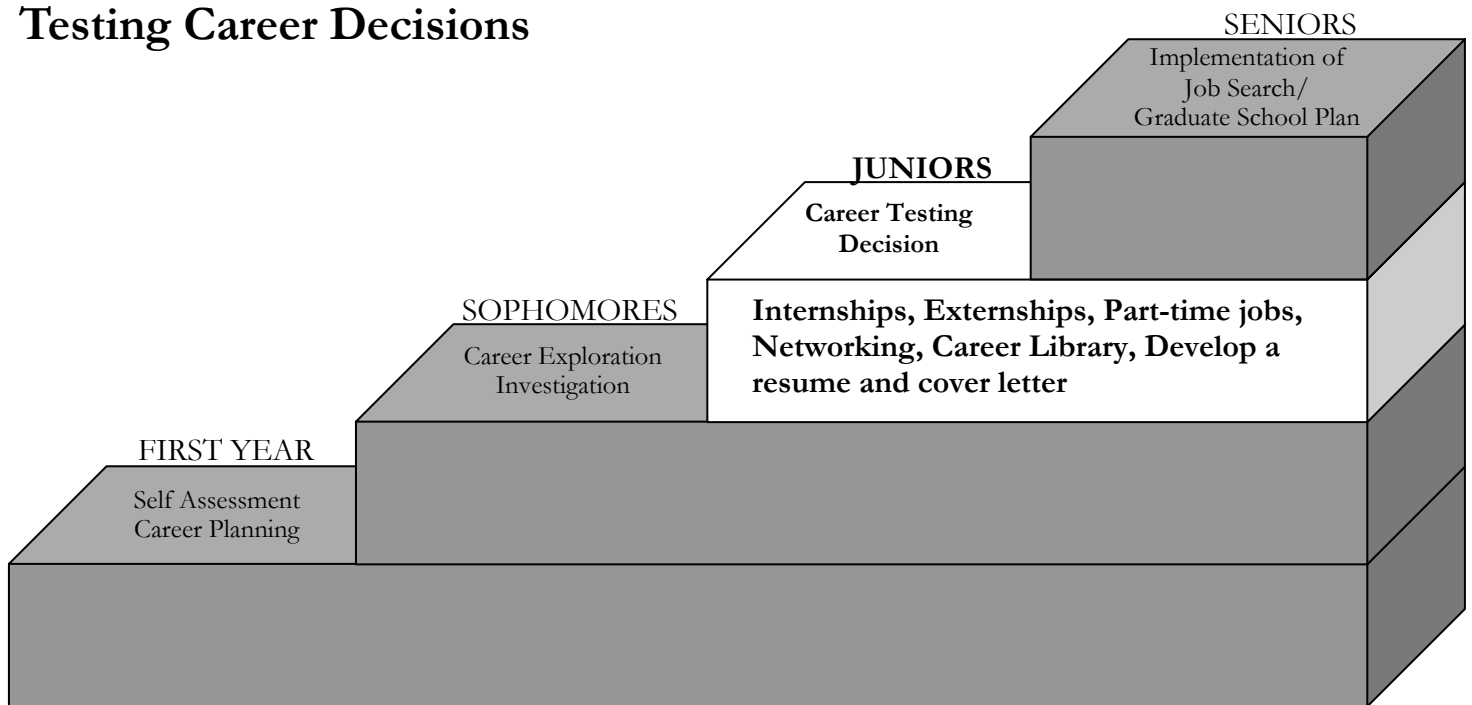




# Developing Your Career Plan—Juniors

## Testing Career Decisions



## ACTION STEPS

- Re-evaluate interests and values
- continue to develop and demonstrate skills: communication, problem solving, analytical thinking, teamwork, dependability, computer and internet use
- Join student chapters of professional organizations
- Explore and make arrangements for off-campus study options
- Decide between graduate school or career entry up on graduation
- Identify at least three career and/or graduate or professional school options that “fit” with your interests
- Investigate graduate schools or interests, their application procedures and deadlines; register and prepare for admissions tests (GRE, LSAT, GMAT, etc.)
- Formulate a job/graduate school search time line and plans
- Discuss your options with academic and Office of Career Services advisors
- Develop a resume
- Get professional experience through an internship, volunteering or a summer job
- Build your network of contacts in fields of interest
- Participate in college sponsored networking events and career fairs

## SERVICES/PROGRAMS

- Attend an Office of Career Services workshop to learn about the process of choosing a career or graduate school path
- Attend an Office of Career Services “Preparing Your Resume” workshop
- Explore information on career options, internships, volunteering opportunities, and graduate schools in the Office of Career Services and its library
- Pick up registration booklets for the GRE, LSAT, or GMAT
- Use the Career Resource Network (CRN) to arrange information interviews with alumni
- Meet with Office of Career Services staff to discuss career opportunities
