Greetings to Model UN Delegates:

Welcome to Hope College and congratulations on being selected as a delegate to the Model UN. We hope the days spent on campus are filled with meaningful opportunities to learn, interact and make new friends.

Becoming a temporary member of the Hope College community carries with it a responsibility to understand and follow our college policies and conference policies, in particular. There are five policies that are important for you to understand and abide by:

1. Hope College is a dry campus, which means there is absolutely no alcohol allowed.
2. Between the hours of 12 a.m. and 10a.m., there can be no visitation by members of the opposite sex in resident hall rooms, apartments, or cottages.
3. After 11:00 p.m., **quiet hours** are expected in dorms. This means noise must be kept to a minimum.
4. Delegates who are staying overnight on-campus are expected to return to their assigned dorm buildings directly after the Thursday night sessions, which end at 11:30. The buildings will be locked at 11:40 pm.
5. Delegates will be required to return to their assigned rooms by 12:00 am. Dorm RAs will be walking through the dorms at midnight and will ask all MUN participants to return to their assigned rooms at that time.

Failure on your part to follow these stated expectations **will** result in the student's advisor being contacted and the delegate will be asked to leave the conference immediately. Please sign this document with your name and high school as noted and bring with you to registration.
